**Cèsar Carreras Monfort** is currently senior lecturer in field of Classical Archaeology at the Department of Antiquity Science at Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB) since 2011. Before, I was lecturer in the Department of Humanities of the Universitat Oberta de Catalunya (UOC) since 1997. I have a PhD in Ancient History (1995) from the Universitat de Barcelona, another PhD in Archaeology (1994) from Southampton University (United Kingdom) and a MScience in Computer application in archaeology (1991) from Southampton University (United Kingdom). From 2008 to 2012 I was also external evaluator of the MA in Ceramic and Lythics for Archaeologists (Department of Archaeology, University of Southampton). Since 1987 I have taken part in different archaeological excavations at national and international level, and currently I am directing some campaigns linked to UAB research projects at Sant Pau de Riu Sec (2011-3), Guissona (2011) and Puig Castellar (2013). From 1996 I took part in a myriad of geophysical surveys (resistivity, magnetometry, GPR and EM), initially as professional in the firm TERRA NOVA Ltd. and now directing a team of the Institut Català d'Arqueologia Clàssica (ICAC)-UAB. I leaded lately surveys of resistivity at Belorado (Burgos), magnetometry at villa de La Olmeda (Palencia), resistivity at Complutum, electromagnetism of induction at Puig Castellar or Les Colomines A (Llívia).

I have got more than 18 years of research acknowledged by the national institution (CENAI), where I took part in a good number of national research projects (DGYCIT) since 1989. I personally directed the **project Aracné** (PB- HUM2004-05067-C02/HIST). I am member of a Research Group (SGR 2009-1163) – **Archaeological Research Group UAB-ICAC. Archaeology of the city and the landscape**, directed by Josep Guitart (Professor UAB). Actually, I take part in two national projects at half time “**Archaeology of the Roman conquest and implementation in Hispania**” (DGYCIT: HAR2012-370003-C03-01: 2013-2015) and “**Amphorae ex Hispania**” (DGYCIT: HAR2011-28244: 2012-2014). At international level, I took part in different projects funded by the EU such as [SEE Arch-Web](#) (An interactive web-based presentation of Southeastern European Archaeology – Socrates program - Minerva: 110665-CP-1-2003-1-GR) o **COINE** (Cultural Objects in Networked Environments) funded by the EU (IST-2001-32258).
