Prof. dr Egle Butkeviciene is a full professor and Vice-Dean for Research at Faculty of Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities, Kaunas University of Technology. She has PhD in Social sciences, sociology. She gives lectures and conducts research on civil society issues, civic participation, social innovations, community development and social inclusion, environmental activism, public policy, and social media. She has also a broad international experience as visiting teacher at universities in Switzerland, Italy, Netherlands, etc. She has been directing and participating in a number of national and international projects: "Democracy in Knowledge Society: The Analysis of Challenges and Possibilities", CINEFOGO, "ICT and Public Access: Investigating the social and economic impact of public access to information and communication technologies", "Social partnerships and local social innovations in rural restructuring", etc. Currently she is a national MC representative in COST Action "Citizen Science to promote creativity, scientific literacy, and innovation throughout Europe". Egle Butkeviciene is/was a governmental expert at the EC H2020 Programme Committee for SC6 'Europe in a changing world – Inclusive, Innovative and Reflective Societies', an expert evaluator of H2020 projects, expert for Roadmap Development of Lithuanian scientific research infrastructures 2008 -2018, Research Council of Lithuania, and a national expert in 6th FP project "ICT for ALL". She also has an experience in coordinating implementation of surveys with nationally representative samples (International Social Survey Programme and European Social Survey). Together with Professor Thomas Bryer, she is responsible for editing a book series "Democratic Dilemmas and Policy Responsiveness", published by Lexington Books.
