Georgia was responsible for the development of the National Library of Greece's digital services and e-infrastructures in the context of the Library's transition to its new premises at the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center. She coordinated the development of 15 projects including the new Digital Repository, the new Website, an e-Lending Platform for Greek e-books, the Greek Libraries' Network Integrated Catalogue, the Greek National Web Archive and the Library's User Authentication and Authorisation Infrastructure.

Previously, Georgia worked for Europeana, Europe's digital archive, library and museum as business and policy coordinator and she led the development and implementation of several EU funded digital cultural heritage aggregation and R&D projects such as Europeana v2.0, Europeana Awareness, TELplus, ATHENA, EUscreen and PrestoPRIME. She also worked at the National Documentation Center of Greece as Communications Specialist developing the national cultural heritage aggregator and promoting open access to cultural and scientific content. She is a Fellow of the Creative Commons' Institute for Open Leadership, and a Europeana Network Councillor.

Georgia studied Media and Communication at the Panteion University of Athens with a major in Cultural Management and I holds an MA in eBusiness Management from ICHEC Brussels Management School.
