Regine is deputy head of the Research & Development department at the Goettingen State and University Library in Germany and leads its programme on research infrastructures and virtual research environments, including the DARIAH-DE coordination office. Graduated in mathematics, she started her career at the Zuse-Institute Berlin as a developer for museums software and worked on providing online access to a museum's collection documentation already in the early 2000s. From 2008 to 2018 she was head of the IT department at the German Documentation Center for Art History – Bildarchiv Foto Marburg where she conducted the implementation of research infrastructure services and brought the archive's huge photographic collection on art and architecture to Europeana and the German Digital Library.

Regine is involved on German and international level in standardization work for documenting cultural heritage since 2001, focusing on semantic interoperability and data quality aspects of integrating and linking the information. She provides leadership for the development of LIDO, the CIDOC-CRM based metadata standard for contributing and sharing cultural heritage information, and is chair of the LIDO Working Group in CIDOC, ICOM's international committee on documentation. She participated in several Europeana-related projects such as Athena Plus and is a member of the Europeana Data Quality Committee.
