Dr. Stella Sylaiou holds a BA (Hons) in History, Archaeology and History of Art (Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece), a M.Sc. degree in Archaeological Computing (University of Southampton, UK), a Diploma in Open and Distance Learning (Hellenic Open University, Greece), a M.A. in Museology (Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece) and a Ph.D. degree from Inter-departmental Postgraduate Program, Protection, Conservation and Restoration of Cultural Monuments (Aristotle University of Thessaloniki), Greece, part of which was funded by the Marie Curie Scholarship for the Transfer of Knowledge (Centre of VLSI and Computer Graphics, University of Sussex, UK). She has carried out two postdoctoral researches in visual perception of artworks with the help of ICT and in the use of crowdsourcing for the promotion of art and culture, funded by the Greek State Scholarships and Research Committee of Aristotle University, Thessaloniki respectively.
